"Sho Nuff Blessed Part Two"- Matthew 5:6-8.

We continued with Pt 2 of the "Sho Nuff Blessed" series **learning to live a natural life that will yield an eternal blessing.**

The Kingdom of God has come, with the incarnation of Jesus, yet it is still 'to come' in the future fulfillment of scripture, that has been revealed to us. But **we must live now, with eager anticipation of our future hope knowing that the choices we make now, have eternal ramifications.**

Just as world class athletes are hungry for championships and awards, Jesus teaches that we, his disciples, must hunger and thirst to live as people of righteousness. This means **we must live in conformity with the moral character of our God.** As God rules in righteousness, we must live righteously. **Our thirst and hunger must not be only for that which satisfies the body, but for that which satisfies the soul.**

Jesus teaches, we must put being righteous over being right. Humility and meekness can help. He also teaches that being merciful is an area where we as Christians must excel. As you consider all God has done for you remember to treat others in a like manner. Lastly, he teaches that if we want to one day see the face of God, we must strive to maintain a pure and clean heart. Let's work on filtering out impurities such as unforgiveness, envy and bitterness. **We don't have to be perfect, but we ought to strive to have a heart like Jesus.** If you are able to do these things, you will be Sho Nuff Blessed.
