“With my Whole Heart”-
Jeremiah 24: 1-7.

People in love desire the whole heart of their companion. As **the lover of our Soul, God gave us a heart that we might ‘know him’ and he requires we give him our whole heart.** God showed Jeremiah two baskets of figs, one good and one bad. Based on your service to God, which

To God, the state of a person’s heart means more than the size of the heart. **In spirituality, it is not about how you ‘feel’ but how you ‘fill’.** This is why we must fill our hearts with

whole heart and not just a piece. **Be resolute in your prayer, praise or service and ensure you are not merely going through the motions. If God is your treasure, give him your whole heart.**
