Do you ever think of yourself as a Saint? If you believe in Jesus and seek to live for him, God considers you that.

We were born in sin and though no longer slaves to it, we are still under its influence. **Stop saying “a saint I ain’t”. Speak words of positive power because you**

serve the “I AM” God.

Our saintly status is not because of anything that we have done, but because of everything that God has done through Christ who lives in us through the Holy Spirit. But understand that if **we are to be a “Church without Walls”**, we must march out of the church and be **a blessing to people in our community**. We must preach the gospel in places where there are no pulpits or pews to people who

are spiritually blind, lame and deaf. The best story to tell them is your story of how Jesus saved a wretch like you. We must **Tell them, Serve them, Teach them and Invite them to Jesus and our fellowship.**

Our church has impacted many people but we have more we can do. Let's **be committed to live out the Great Commission and serve others more than we serve ourselves**. When

we go marching out, it will help **ensure that we are “in that number” of the Saints who will go marching into Heaven.**
