“What Are You Counting On?” - Matt 21:12-14.

In the text, Jesus encountered money changers who literally were counting on tables. But figuratively, **all of us have something we are counting on in life.** God challenges us to carefully consider the things or people we count on to keep and sustain us.

**We must remember,**

grieve Jesus, through the Holy Spirit he left for us, he remains faithful and true to hear our prayers and meet our needs. **We can count on God when we can't count on the economy, family, friends, or jobs.**
