'There was a Time' Ephesians 4:17-24.

One thing common to all people is we 'have a past'. This applies to people in the church and in the world. The challenge for us is to change our thinking and living to be more Christ like. Just as you can't put 'your old mess in a new dress', you can't put 'your old talk in your new walk'.

In essence, we are to be "prisoners of Christ" who are **completely under his authority and bound to do**

learned in the world? The Apostle Paul says this kind of thinking is futile, ignorant and leads to separation from God. All of us can say 'there was a time when I', and can fill in the blanks. But God is looking for his sheep to have a renewed mind that leads to a changed heart. His saints acknowledge 'there was a time' when we walked in darkness but now we strive to walk in the light of our loving Lord.

what he commands. In this way, we honor him in a way that deems us worthy of his call for us to be part of his kingdom.

We need **not dwell in our past** but should 'reflect' and remember how we used to be, to appreciate just how far we've come. All of us are on the Sanctification road where we are **moving from selfishness to holiness.** Our goal should be to first please God, then please ourselves.

Has there been a real change in your life or are you holding on to bad habits Jesus. Our price is that we can't go all the places we used to go, nor show all the things we used to show. But isn't that a small sacrifice in comparison to what Christ has done for you?
