'How did I end up like this'- Gen 21: 8-19.

Life can be like an elevator that escorts you to the highest heights then drops you to the depths of despair. Living the dreams you had as a child are the exception, not the rule. Most end up in jobs, relationships, and circumstances they did not plan to be in. Your current state may be dictated by decisions and choices made. It could also be impacted by outside forces we don't totally control. But
