Pastoral Notes

"Mother Wit" Matthew 15: 21-28.

Our Mother's Day worship message focused on a Gentile mother with a demon possessed daughter who sought the mercy of Jesus. She used "mother wit" (that sixth sense from God) to get Jesus to grant her request and heal her child. and wanted Jesus to dismiss her for what they considered 'her excessive begging'. Jesus explained his purpose of first saving the nation of Israel and gave her an example that would have offended many. This mother, however, did not get offended but worshipped Jesus instead. She showed a manner of faith that

- 1. Mothers feel the pain of their families
- 2. Mothers should worship even in the midst of a storm
- 3. Mothers know what to say & when to say it

Initially Jesus did not answer her request. Sometimes we too will pray and not get an immediate response or answer. Usually, this silence from Jesus is his way of testing us. He wants to see how much we want it and how faithful we will be to wait for it.

The disciples did not show any concern for the hurting mother blew Jesus away. He commended her "great faith" and healed her daughter.
