Call To Worship

Leader: In the midst of life's storms, God is there, even when we go off course as Jonah did in his disobedience to God. The Lord is merciful and provides us the grace to reverse course and avoid spiritual shipwreck. Jesus is the only true anchor, firm and secure. Jonah 1, 2:1 | Hebrews 6:19,20

ALL: With Jesus as our captain and compass, we can weather the storms of life for He knows what is ahead of us and can provide safe passage. Let us earnestly encourage each other to steer course with prayer and faith until we harbor at our heavenly home. Matthew 8:23-27 | Hebrews 2:10

Scripture Lesson: Acts 27:13-18 (NIV)

Leader: 13 When a gentle south wind began to blow, they saw their opportunity; so they weighed anchor and sailed along the shore of Crete.

Congregation: 14 Before very long, a wind of hurricane force, called the Northeaster, swept down from the island. **16** The ship was caught by the storm and could not head into the wind; so we gave way to it and were driven along.

Leader: 16 As we passed to the lee of a small island called Cauda, we were hardly able to make the lifeboat secure, **17** so the men hoisted it aboard. Then they passed ropes under the ship itself to hold it together. Because they were afraid they would run aground on the sandbars of Syrtis, they lowered the sea anchor and let the ship be driven along.

ALL: 18 We took such a violent battering from the storm that the next day they began to throw the cargo overboard. AMEN

Pastor: 1 Cor. 11:25


After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.
